We work with **lesbians, trans* and gender non-conforming people** to enable them to exercise autonomy and choice.

We work with **women and girls** because they are rights-bearers, independent of the gendered roles that are imposed upon them.

what we do

We **strengthen** feminist leadership and collective power. We **advance** sexual and reproductive health and rights.

We **address** gender-based violence and promote well-being. We **amplify** the voice and visibility of marginalized women, girls, trans* and gender non-conforming people.
